Hi Everyone

Just a quick note to let you know (if you haven't heard through the grapevine already), Audrey (40878) crashed her Hornet 900 Sunday week ago.

She's in RPH, Major Trauma Unit, Room J where visiting is 9:00-13:00 and 15:00-20:00.

Her head, neck, spinal cord and internal organs are OK - minor bruising only.

LHS: Upper arm*, shoulder*, collarbone* shoulder blade, all ribs and lower left leg - all these have multiple fractures and severe bruising.

RHS: Wrist*, lower leg* - these have multiple fractures and severe bruising.

Spine: T 4 and T5 cracked.

* These items have been or will be plated and pinned to assist recovery.

The vertebrae cracks are to be left to heal naturally - flat on her back for 6 to 8 weeks (estimate).

Due to skin abrasions and wounds in the operating area, further work on the plating and pinning of fractures has been delayed until the skin is in a condition that will not introduce infection in the operational area.

Her current condition is 1000% better than when I flew back from site on the day it happened .

The Joondalup Branch Members have been marvellous in the support and visits from many of her friends in the Ulysses Club.

Her sister has arrived today, her Dad is coming in three weeks and her youngest sister will be arriving after her Dad.

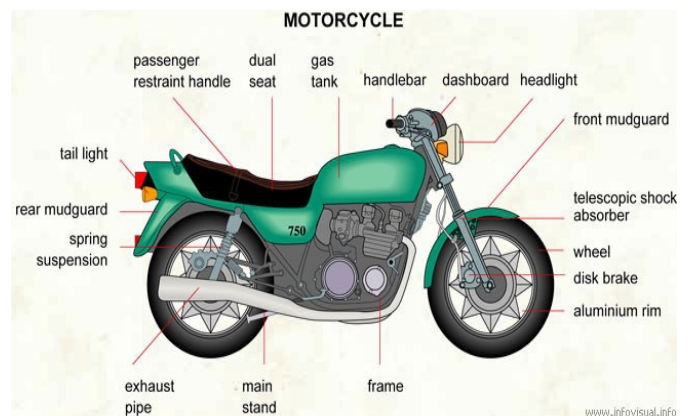
Bill replied, "I have been in gaol."

Sailing along on a stunning autumn Sunday this year's Bakery Run was delicious. About 280 kilometres of varied roads with numerous stops for good food and great conversations made for a really scrumptious day for the 15 bikes on the Bakery cruise.

At the start of the ride the group divided into 5 tasting teams each team given the task of scoring a particular delicacy. There was a Meat Pie tea, a Cornish' Pastie team, Sausage Roll, Apple -Slice and Chocolate Eclair teams. Each team of tasters received a survey form and off they sailed in line astern.

We had the wiggly woads such as Mundaring Weir Road, Riley Road, Roland Road, O'Brien Road and Lilydale Road. We had the fast, straights like Great Eastern Highway and Toodyay Road and we had the sweepers like Spencers Brook Road and York Road. Something for everyone hopefully. And to put the icing on the cake, pun intended, we sampled 6 bakeries.

Mundaring Village Bakery was our first stop, Gidgegannup Bakery our next port of call, Baker's Hill Bakery next, then on to Toodyay for lunch, as if we were hungry. After lunch the bloated bellies barrelled non-stop to York via Northam and Spencers Brook. At York we tasted the wares of LJ's Cafe, as close to a bakery as you can get, and from there to our last stop at the new Mundaring Bakery for a final tasting and debriefing.

It became clear at the first stop that tasting meat pies all day would become challenging. (In fact a Member of the Sausage Roll team felt decidedly icky after his first tasting and ate very little for the rest of the day.) To solve this problem teams swapped survey sheets along the way. Despite this, a Chocolate Eclair team member whipped out at the last stop. One connoisseur taster declared his first Meat Pie to have a fine bouquet, to be fruity on the nose and to linger pleasantly on the palate.

Rides will be tailored for all with a long ride to Kalbarri and a shorter ride around surrounding areas.

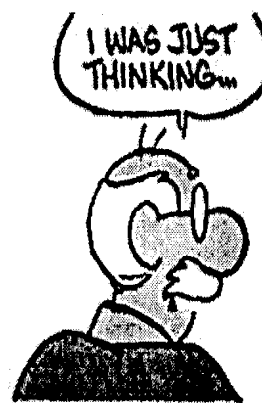
Show and Shine will be conducted with the Mid West Car Club who will also be running a show and shine that weekend.

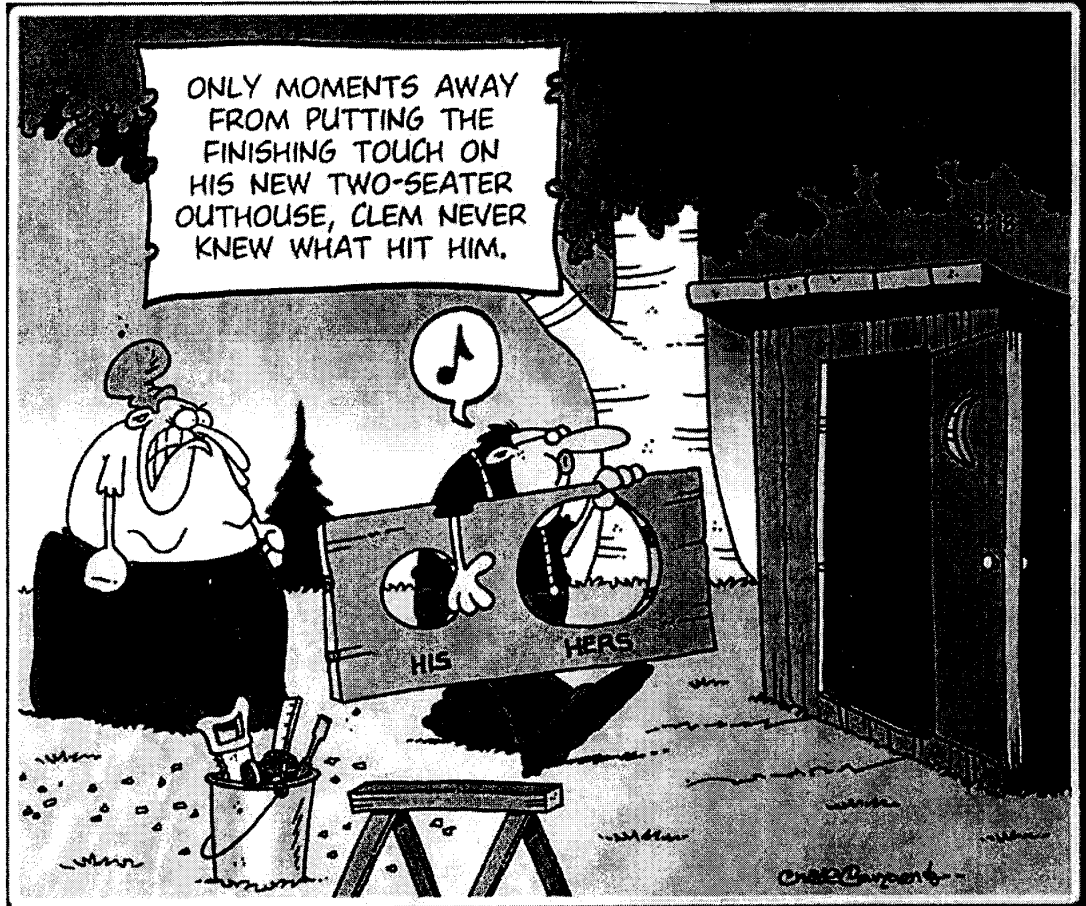
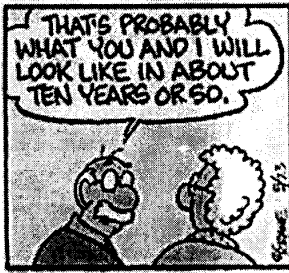

They produce a delicious range of freshly baked cakes, pies, pastries, bread and bread rolls daily, as well as a good selection of takeaway foods.

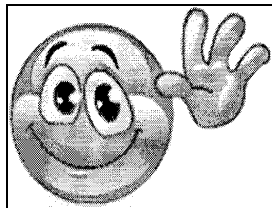

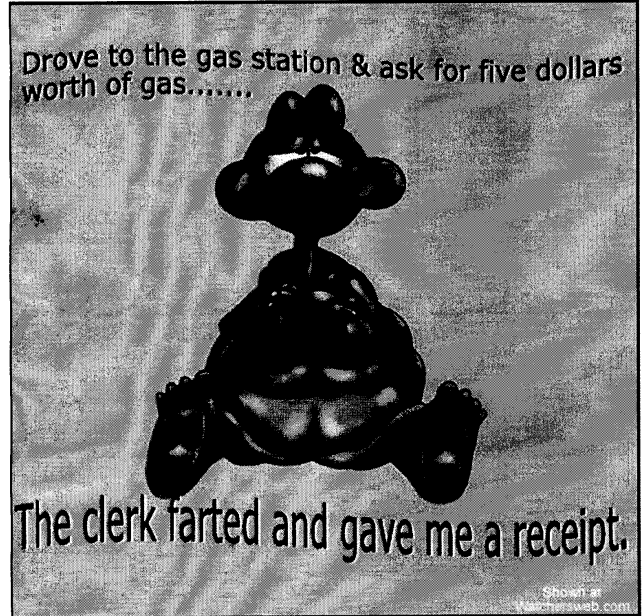
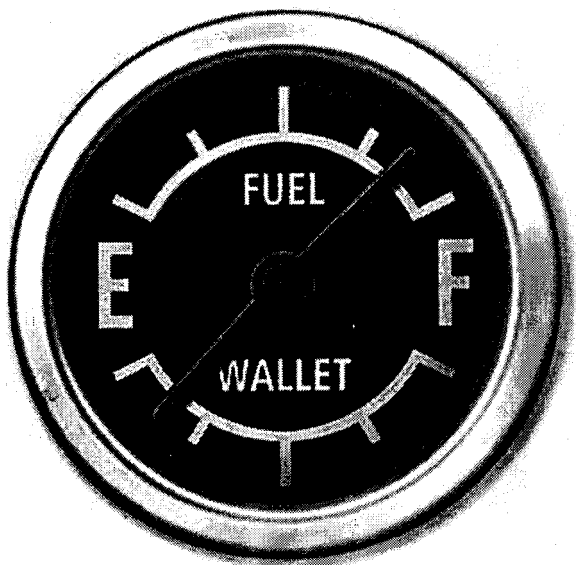
They do a full range of cafe style coffees also.

REPORT ON WELFARE VISIT TO ANNIE COLLINS

at Ward 10 Shenton Park Hospital,

Tues 25th March.
from Edwina

Actively smiling, sitting erectly up in bed - Annie greeted me warmly. Until then we had only conversed on the phone, and I hadn't seen her since Coffs Harbour when rostered with her as Volunteer in the Information booth.

It did me good and shamed me for my own self concern about my own dilemma, because there she was - that great burly extrovert activist confined almost immovable in bed with great hunks of steel constraining her right leg, It transpired she is continuing at the daily will of 'what will be' and in constant and considerable pain. The other leg also sustained injury.

Watching her in action, you wouldn't have noted the pain bit. She told me she decided some weeks ago to reject anymore systemed drug dosing and restart her 'life'.

All continued and smiling, and outgoing as though nothing was wrong, Annie spoke enthusiastically to a visiting work colleague about what is happening at her former workplace for incapacitated adults. That intercourse told me the truth about her condition and prospects. She is being so valiant - and is wholeheartedly using all her natural capacity and personality strengths to see this healing time through with gusto.

There are signs of 'uncertainty' as to whether she can again do the ride - [or maybe want to]. suggested that when the leg heals well enough will be the best time to consider her options about that anyway. She is maintaining an intelligent approach to pursuing her own healing and it is obviously working.

Doctors appear to be still pursuing day to day 'managment of the infection' within the steel filled hole. After the steel is removed a hole filling [like a sandbag] will replace it covered by a special leg stocking [all of which items she has alongside her for inspection] until the bones have knitted properly. It can still be a matter of time, but when all works well her patience and long suffering through it all will have saved the leg.

Despite the continuing serious scenario she is living through, like always Annie continues all positive and genuinely cheerful and I had to admire her grit. It made me feel like a wimp in my mini dilemmas which depressed me so badly.

Before I left, you should have seen the look on her face, when I opened my bag and gave her the Road Rider and Jack Bowens Around Aus. Her body leaped in the bed, she got so excited at the sound of a mc mag to read. I assured her it is our hope that the Bowen adventure would make her feel she was having a ride around Australia herself, and if she closed her eyes it would do her good to feel the ride. She was like a kid with a new Barbie Doll.

Lets all keep her 'bike conscious' throughout this ordeal and send her any bike related information you have to pass her time as it were 'on wheels'.

Know this, she is a Giant of a woman - and I had never known her well as Annie left our club for a closer branch but I had heard she was a woman of great substance.


